Qualifications/Experience

Fieldworkers must have/be able to:

- Willing to travel and have some over night visits in northern communities
- To work independently with youth and adults
- Excellent communication skills, both verbal and written
- Be familiar with, and willing to work in a setting of aboriginal cultures
- Proficient skiing ability in both classic and skate technique
- Knowledge of NSCRD's Programs and Services
- To provide guidance and reports to the Ski Fit North Steering Committee
- Submit indicator reports to the Program Manager for Sport and Recreation
- Post secondary education, Cansi Level I, and/or experience in the ski instruction field is an asset
- Experience working with both able-bodied and disabled skiers would be an asset
- Valid First Aid/CPR or commitment to take during the season
- A valid driver's license and vehicle
- Criminal Record Check and Child Abuse Check
- Part time seasonal 4-5 days per week, January 2010 – March 2010



All positions report to the Program Manager for Sport and Recreation and supported by the SFN steering committee.

Competitive Coach/Fieldworker:

This position requires familiarity with grant proposals, sponsorship and fundraising. The competitive coach/fieldworker is required to work with the Ski Fit North steering committee and existing club coaches to help communities develop clubs beyond the school level. It is preferable that this fieldworker live in La Ronge from Jan 2010 to March 2010. This fieldworker must also have excellent organizational skills and be able to set and maintain a balanced schedule to allow practices and clinics with competitive racers across the North. To have proficient cross country skiing technique (comparable to level 2 requirement), an extensive racing background and, knowledge of up-to-date ski and waxing techniques for a variety of snow conditions. To have the ability to set training plans for ages 12-18 and support racers in their plans. Certification: Introduction to Community Coaching (ICC) and Community Coaching (CC) (or existing NCCP level 1); Preferred - Learning to Train (L2T) and Training to Train (T2T) (or existing NCCP level 2) or commitment to pursue L2T and T2T certifications this season. Compensation \$21 per hour, plus expenses.

Information about La Ronge

La Ronge is the largest community in Northern Saskatchewan with over 3500 people residing in the town itself and about 2000 people on the adjacent First Nations lands of the Lac La Ronge Indian Band and some 1000 people residing in the neighbouring settlement of Air Ronge.

Set just inside the rugged Canadian Shield about two and a half hours north of Prince Albert, La Ronge is situated on the shores of Lac La Ronge in the heart of the Churchill River system and offers top-notch recreational opportunities.

There are 5 km of night-lit and groomed trails at the Nut Point Provincial Campground located in the town site. There are also about 20km of groomed trails and a chalet just 15 minutes outside of town at the Don Allen Ski Trails, and the 21km of trails connecting the Nut Point trails to the Don Allen Trails. Grooming is done by the Ministry of Tourism, Parks, Culture and Sports (TPCS) as well as avid volunteers. La Ronge is also home to the annual Don Allen Saskaloppet and two annual Sask Cup Races. Cross Country Skiing is a pastime for sport, culture and recreation in Northern Saskatchewan and the Ski Fit North program is in its 21st season. Come and join us and apply today!
