****One or possibly two new schools will be selected to be a part of the 2010-2011 Northern Drama Project – APPLY NOW! One application per community (regardless of the number of schools)****

Is your school and community interested in drama? Would you like to be a part of a northern drama development project that includes:

- mentorship from Saskatchewan Drama Association to select, produce and perform a play in your community (October 2010 – April 2011: includes 2 one day workshops in your community)
- being part of a Northern Drama Festival (April 15 & 16, 2011)
- from the Northern Drama Festival, one community will be selected to participate in the SDA Provincial Drama Festival (May 12-14, 2011)

Communities will be selected and notified soon after the 15th. **Please keep in mind the first meeting regarding the project details will be October 18 in Prince Albert ... we will get right at it! Project roles for community/school drama groups:

These are the roles and expectations of the participating community/school drama groups and directors. Once the participating communities are selected, a partnership agreement is signed.

- Host two, one day (minimum four hour) workshops during school hours (workshop leader/mentor provided by SDA as described above). The 1st workshop must be completed by the end of January and the 2nd prior to Easter break.
- Working with the SDA mentor as needed, agree to select, produce and perform a drama production.
- Complete the necessary forms for being part of the SDA Festival’s program and the Northern Drama Project.
- The director(s) must attend the first, in person orientation meeting held in the fall in Prince Albert (October 18), as well as two conference calls during the project.
- The NCS are responsible for all costs not included by SDA or the NSCRD (i.e. SDA fees, royalties, equipment and supplies, etc. and others as determined based on funding support received).
- Communicate with and respond to the SDA, their mentors, and the NSCRD as necessary for smooth implementation and the betterment of the project.
- Hold the drama production in your community (i.e. prior to or after the Northern Drama Festival) as able.
- Participate in the Northern Drama Festival on April 15 & 16, 2011.
- If it is agreed to have a competitive based Northern Drama Festival, and should your community be selected as the winning production, agree to participate in the Provincial Drama Festival on May 12-14, 2011 in Regina.
- Declare a commitment to the drama project from the school administration.

Project Summary of Components and Timeline

Early Oct. - Decision on returning communities from last year's project
Sept. 15 - Community application deadline, with selection process to follow (1-2 new communities)
Oct. 18 - Meeting at beginning of project of partners and community leaders/directors, as well as school administration and division/education authority if possible, in Prince Albert from 1:00 – 6:00 pm (supper included – location to be determined)
November 1 - January 31 (1st Workshop) and February 1 – March 31 (2nd Workshop) - 2 one day workshops in your community with the SDA mentor, minimum 4 hour workshops
January – Host community for the Northern Drama Festival has been selected
January/February – Conference Call with all partners (mid project)
Ongoing - technical support from SDA mentors
Ongoing - Logistical support from NSCRD
April – Prior to the Northern Drama Festival, a conference call meeting will be held with all partners/communities to confirm details, etc. for the Northern Drama Festival
April 15 & 16 - Northern Drama Festival (location to be determined)
April (last week) – 1 day workshop with winning drama group to prepare for Provincial Festival (if necessary and able)
May 12-14 - Provincial Drama Festival (1 drama group – winner from NDF)
