## **Selection Criteria**

To be considered for selection for Team North XC Ski Team at the 2023 SWG you must:

- 1) Compete in both the sprint and classic distance races on January 21, 2023
- 2) Belong to a Cross Country Saskatchewan member ski club.

The team will consist of 3 - Junior Girls; 3 - Junior Boys; 3 - Senior Girls; and 3 - Senior Boys.

Final team selection/notification\* will be made by email and phone on or before Tuesday, January 31, 2023.

\*Team North coaches and manager reserve the right for the final selection of the team members.

### Formula to Determine Top 3 Qualifier in each Category

To determine the top 3 in each category, we will use a formula combining classic distance and skate sprint races – There are two sets of results as an example with times and points calculated related to the winner's time. **Less points earned, the better.** This is a model developed by the FIS. When comparing a distance race and a sprint race the F-Value which is greater for distance races, meaning that if you finish 2 seconds behind in the distance race you will earn fewer points than if you finished 2 seconds behind in the sprint.

# 1. Competitions

<u>Free technique sprint race</u> with mass starts. Racers are to be at the race venue on Saturday by 10:00 a.m. for bib pick up and to be ready for the race start at 11:00 a.m. sharp! Race office opens 10:00am at the Don Allen Trails and will remain open until the day's official results are posted.

<u>Classic distance race</u> with mass starts. Racers are to be at the race venue on Saturday by 1:00 p.m. to be ready for the race start at 2:00 p.m. sharp! Race office will be at open 10:00am at Don Allen Trails and will remain open until the day's official results are posted.

Race venue is the Don Allen Ski Trail system, located 20 km north of La Ronge on Highway 102 at the junction of Highway 102 & the Nemeiben Lake Road.

Racecourse for the classic distance event and skate sprint will be groomed and marked no later than Friday, January 20, at 4:00 p.m.

Waxing facilities: An indoor wax room with electrical plug-ins suitable for irons will be available to coaches and athletes. However, race organizers reserve the right to control the number of persons in the wax room at any one time.

# 2. Hosting, Sanctioning & Rules

Competitions are hosted by the La Ronge Ski Club.

<u>Protests</u>: Any coach or athlete protesting a race result shall file a Protest Form with the Race Secretary at the Race Office within 15 minutes following the posting of the unofficial result being challenged.

No Medium/High Fluoro (HF) Waxes: A reminder to all coaches, parents and competitors that the CCS High Performance Committee has directed that no Medium Fluoro or High Fluoro (powders, pucks, blocks, and liquid) are to be used in Sask Cup competitions. And no cold weather powder additives and hardeners are permitted. Low-fluoro waxes will be allowed. Structure tools are permitted.

## 3. Coaches' Meetings

A first coaches' meeting will be held the morning of Saturday, January 21, 2023, at 10:30 am at the Don Allen Trails.



## 5. Registration

<u>Late Registrations</u>: Late registrations may be accepted at the discretion of the Race Organizing Committee.

<u>Waiver</u>: As part of the online registration process, racers (or their legal guardians on their behalf) will agree to the terms of Nordiq Canada's "Informed Consent and Assumption of Risk Agreement."

#### 6. Food & Drinks

#### 7. Cancellation

If the event competition is to be postponed (we have an alternative date of Saturday, January 28) or cancelled due to cold weather or other cause, the Event Organizing Committee will inform NSCRD as soon as practicable. The Event Organizing Committee will also endeavor to advise coaches and athletes as soon as possible. Primary notice of any postponement or cancellation will be made by posting a notice on the Cross Country Saskatchewan website, on the La Ronge Ski Club website at www.larongeskiclub.ca and on the Club's Facebook page at "La Ronge Nordic Ski Club."
